



<p><b><u>Writing</u></b></p> <p>Create a fact file about King Arthur who was thought to live in the Saxon period.</p>  <p>Who was he?</p>	<p><b><u>Art/DT</u></b></p> <p>Find out about the artefacts found at Sutton Hoo. Recreate an object that was found at Sutton Hoo, or any other Anglo Saxon find, using suitable techniques and materials. Write an information card to go with the artefact.</p>	<p><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p>How long was the Saxon period for? Choose 5 significant dates and put them on a timeline. Work out the time difference between each event.</p>
<p><b><u>Creative</u></b></p> <p>Design an outfit for an Anglo Saxon warrior. Try to make it look fearsome but at the same time keep it historically accurate. Remember to include the weapons they would carry. Remember to label your warrior.</p>	<p><b>Interesting Invaders</b></p> <p>Choose 6 activities to complete this term.</p>	<p><b><u>Reading Challenge</u></b></p> <p>Create a book poster to inspire the other children in the class to read. You could do it about an author, or a particular book or about why it is good to read. Make it as colourful as you can and think really carefully about presentation.</p>
<p><b><u>Design and Technology</u></b></p> <p>The Anglo Saxons built their own houses using any materials that they could find in forests. What designs can you create that you might have found out that Anglo Saxons liked to use?</p>
<p><b><u>Creative</u></b></p> <p>Find out about Anglo Saxon law and order. Create a wanted poster. Explain what the criminal has done wrong. Explain what the punishment will be. Make sure the punishment links to Anglo Saxon times.</p>	<p><b><u>Writing</u></b></p> <p>Imagine yourself as an archaeologist. Imagine digging and finding some Anglo Saxon treasure. What did you find? Write a description of all the different artefacts that you found. You could turn this into an exciting story!</p>	<p><b><u>Creative</u></b></p> <p>Find out about Anglo Saxon medicine and how they cured some common ailments such as colds and headaches. Create an advertising poster. Use persuasive techniques to make the reader want to use your medicine.</p>
