Maths

Create your own maths word problems based on a Roman theme. These could include the four operations, Roman Numerals or fractions. For example, A Roman soldier's ration of wheat was 66 pounds a month. How many pounds of wheat did he get a year?

Bake

Research food from the Roman times. Find a recipe and make it at home. Take a picture of your final creation and bring it in - or make enough to share with the class (and teachers!)

Computing

Using Minecraft (or another computer design package) design a Roman villa. Think about the different rooms they would have and their appropriate size and layout.

Research and create/make

Research weapons used during gladiator battles and make one of your own. Bring it in or take a photograph of yourself in a suitable pose!

Science - Electricity

Draw a simple circuit diagram that has a bulb, buzzer or motor. Think: how many batteries (cells) will you need?

Art

Research and then create your own Roman mosaic. It could be a copy of one that you have seen or a creation of your own.

Draw and write

You heard about the legend of how Rome originated with two brothers Romulus and Remus.

Create a comic strip version of the story.

bubbles to help the story flow
and some captions.
