Vocabulary

Charcoal: a residue when wood, bone, or other organic matter is heated in the absence of air.

Gestural: relating to movements, especially when these express ideas or feelings.

Sketch: a rough or unfinished drawing or painting, often made to assist in making a more finished picture.

Chiaroscuro: the treatment of light and shade in drawing and painting.

Smudging: it's the cause of something to become messily smeared by rubbing it.
