Produce a fact file about WW2 planes. Find facts about British, American and German planes. You could focus on one plane, such as the Spitfire or include a number of different ones.

## **Research and Bake**

Research WW2 recipes. Choose your favourite and bring in a copy of the recipe along with a photo of your finished creation. You could bring in some of your baking to share too.

#### Write

Imagine you have heard the air-raid siren and are in the air-raid shelter. Write a diary entry explaining what you can hear/see/smell. What are you doing to keep yourself occupied? How are you feeling?
