

<p><b>Play Leaders</b></p> <p>Research games that children used to play in Roman times. Create your own version of it that could be played on the playground. Think about how you could lead this during a lunchtime.</p>	<p><b>Toga Tangle</b></p> <p>The Romans wore togas. Research the common features of togas then design and make your own. Take a photo of you wearing it!</p> <p>Write instructions for how you made the toga.</p>	<p><b>Write and draw - Roman Myth Or Legend</b></p> <p>Retell the story of a Roman myth or legend and present it as a comic strip, e.g. Romulus and Remus, Androcles and the Lion.</p> 
<p><b>Write: A to Z</b></p> <p>Create an A to Z of the Roman Empire, with a definition or fact for each word. For example:  A – amphitheatre: the centre of entertainment in Roman times. Unfortunately Pompeii sits on the site of a volcano.</p> <p>Make your own volcano and experiment with combining different substances to make it explode! Include features such as a mosaic floor and columns. Draw a plan of your building and then use a variety of materials from around home such as paper/cardboard, little stones etc. to make it.</p>
